Literacy Starter 1- Nouns

Nouns are the names of things. The word noun comes from the Latin word, Nomen, meaning name.

Common Nouns

Common nouns are the names of things like lake, town, tent, bus, lizard, scorpions. They are not particular things and are not written with a capital letter.

1. Make a list of twenty nouns- things you can see in the classroom. You can start with- *book*

Proper Nouns

Proper nouns are the names of *particular* things- things that are proper to themselves. Stanley is a proper noun. It is the name of a particular boy.

All proper nouns must be written with a capital letter.

All of these are proper nouns:

Days of the week	e.g. Wednesday
Months of the year	e.g. August
Names of people	e.g. Felix
Names of places	e.g. Poland
	Croydon
	Melbourne
Street names	e.g. Croydon St.
