- 1. What does Othello's language in line 35 suggest about his state of mind? How is his language now much more like that of lago than it was?
- 2. Do you think lago anticipated Bianca's appearance at line 145? How is he able to use her arrival to further his deception?
- 3. How does lago go about providing the visual proof of Desdemona's infidelity that Othello had earlier asked for?
- 4. What's different about Othello's attitude toward Desdemona lines 178 -- 210? What causes this change?
- 5. How does lago manipulate Lodovico in the last 20 lines of IV, 1?

4.2

- 6. According to Othello what's the worst part of being a cuckold?
- 7. Why doesn't Desdemona react more strongly when Othello accuses her of infidelity?
- 8. Where in Act IV, 2, does Desdemona finally start to fight back? Explain her physical reaction right after Othello leaves at line 92.
- 9. Who is the first person in the play to figure out lago's duplicity? How is lago able to manipulate this person, even after the truth is known?

4.3

- 10. As Emilia prepares her mistress's wedding bed, Desdemona talks of her mother's servant Barbary who was forsaken by a mad lover; then she and Emilia talk about whether they would be unfaithful to their husbands or not. What is the significance of this conversation?
- 11. Explain exactly how lago manipulates every single person who appears in this scene.

- 12. As he enters Desdemona's bedchamber in order to kill her, Othello mutters: "It is the cause, it is the cause, my soul." What is he talking about? In what way might he be rationalizing Desdemona's murder?
- 13. Often at the end of a play, Shakespeare's tragic heroes have a moment of insight: According to what he says in lines 340, what is Othello's insight into himself?
